She taught at the School District of Crandon for a total of 36 years where she taught second grade for eight years before teaching first grade for 28 years. Prior to coming to Crandon, Norma also taught one year in White Lake. Norma's dedication and service to the School District of Crandon made a significant impact on many people. She retired in 1983 and enjoyed 32 years of retirement before her death in 2015.

"When I first started teaching here in Crandon, and people learned that my maiden name is Pfeiffer, I constantly heard stories and recollections of how my grandmother was their teacher or how he/she loved having my grandma for their teacher. It was always so amazing to me that people I knew, and some that I didn't, remembered my grandma and how they enjoyed her so much, or how
