

Wisconsin State Statute 118 requires all local school boards to provide the parents and guardians of all enrolled students notice of the academic standards in Mathematics, Science, Reading & Writing(Literacy), Geography, and History that have been adopted by the School Board and that will be in effect during each school year. Academic standards serve as rigorous goals for teaching and learning. The School District of Crandon is committed to ensuring academic excellence in every classroom and every school so that all of our students perform at high levels and achieve academic excellence.

This notice is to provide a reference to the standards that the School District of Crandon has adopted for the 2022-2023 school pursuant to sections 118.30 (1g)(a) and 120.12 (13)(b) of the state statutes:

Mathematics: Wisconsin Model Academic Standards

English Language Arts: (includes Reading and Writing) Wisconsin Model Academic Standards

Science: Wisconsin Model Academic Standards

Social Studies: (includes Geography and History) Wisconsin Model Academic Standards

What are Wisconsin Academic Standards?

Wisconsin Academic Standards specify what students should know and be able to do in the classroom. They serve as goals for teaching and learning.

Setting high standards enables students, parents, educators, and citizens to know what students should have learned at a given point in time.

In Wisconsin, all state standards serve as a model. Locally elected school boards adopt academic standards in each subject area to best serve their local community. -*WI DPI*
